Herman L. "Bud" Steudel of Gainesville passed away on August 31 a few weeks before his 91st birthday. Bud was born on September 26, 1926 in Passaic, New Jersey to Max and Lilly Steudel. Bud enlisted in the Army in World War II and served as a medical technician. After his discharge from active duty, he served as a Second Lieutenant in the Army Reserve until 1953.
