Peter Charles Lenseth, 70, passed away at home on August 21, 2018. He

was born on July 15, 1948 to Charles and Alberta (Yeater) Lenseth in Muscatine, Iowa. In his teen years, the family moved to Ft Myers, Florida. He attended Cypress Lake High School where he played varsity football wearing #72. After graduating high school, he moved to St. Petersburg, Florida and attended St. Petersburg Vocational Technical School where he studied surveying and architecture. He graduated in 1969.

He married Linda Lee Bennett on October 3, 1969 at Lealman United Methodist Church. Peter was employed with the Pinellas County Zoning Department for over 34 years and was a member of the US Florida National Guard for 17 years in the communications sector. After he retired, they moved to High Springs, Florida.

Peter was a loyal Buccaneer and Yankee sports fan, an avid reader mostly of sci-fi, had many collections like Coca Cola, Star Wars and Star Trek, books, and sports memorabilia especially anything to do with statistics. He was a fanatic about movies with popcorn and Snowcaps.
