He was born in Dallas, TX, on April 9, 1932. He attended Baylor University in Waco, TX, and is a graduate of Baylor College of Dentistry. He served as President of the Dallas County Dental Society, Southwest Academy Restorative Dentistry and the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry. He was named Dallas County

Dental Society Dentist of the Year, and was founder of the Margaret and Roland Lynn Lectureship at Baylor College of Dentistry. The Lynn family has the distinction of being the first family with three generations to graduate from Baylor College of Dentistry.

In his early years he was a scratch golfer. He introduced his family to the world of hunting, and raised English Setters, Labrador Retrievers and thoroughbred horses.

A true professional and patriot he was a direct descendant of John and Priscilla Alden who came to America on the Mayflower. He was a remarkable man with a loving personality and a superb sense of humor. His memory will be cherished by his family, patients and friends. We know that he is made whole and is in Heaven.
